Selection of Pupils for Appropriate Secondary Education, 1958

CHEADLE MOSELEY HALL

After giving careful consideration to the information contained on his Primary School Record and to the results he obtained in the Common Entrance Examination this year, the Committee has decided to allocate a place to your son in the Secondary Grammar School named above with effect from the beginning of the new School Year in September, 1958. **This place is not transferable.** Its acceptance will involve you in no expenditure for tuition fees or for books.

It is important for you to note that, if you accept this place, you should complete the enclosed Form of Agreement, and return it to me, if possible, **within seven days.**

If you do not wish to accept the place, it is still most important that you should inform me accordingly as early as possible.

By accepting the place now offered you undertake to keep your son at the Secondary Grammar School until at least the end of the School Year in which he reaches the age of 16 years. You will appreciate that if he is withdrawn from the School before this, he will have failed to obtain the full benefits of a Grammar School Course. Furthermore, he will have occupied a place from which some other boy might have obtained this advantage.

If your child resides more than three miles from the Secondary Grammar School, the Education Committee will be prepared to consider an application for the payment of his travelling expenses. In some cases, however, the Committee provides special transport for children attending Secondary Grammar Schools and in these cases, no fares are charged, and no grant is therefore made. You should in the first place apply to your local Divisional Education Officer to ascertain whether a special bus will be available to convey your son to and from the Secondary Grammar School named above. If not, and if he resides more than three miles from the School, application may be made to this Office on the enclosed Form 10/G8 for a grant towards his travelling expenses. The name and address of your local Divisional Education Officer is given overleaf.

The County Education Committee also offers grants in necessitous cases towards the cost of certain distinctive school clothing and school dinners, and if you wish to apply for these, you should write to me for a form of application (Form 5/G7). Grants will only be made in those cases where the total parental income falls within the limits of the Committee's Scale of Aid. The articles of distinctive school clothing for which grants can be made for boys are limited to a cap and badge.

The Headmaster of the Secondary Grammar School will be writing to you in the near future inviting you to visit the school to discuss various matters connected with the school. If you accept the place, you should keep the Headmaster informed of any change of address you may make while your son is attending the School.
